Present Simple	<i>We eat tasty food.</i>	<i>She said that they ate tasty food.</i>
Past Simple	<i>We ate tasty food.</i>	<i>She said that they had eaten tasty food.</i>
Future Simple	<i>We will eat tasty food.</i>	<i>She said that they would eat tasty food.</i>
Present Continuous	<i>We are eating tasty food.</i>	<i>She said that they were eating tasty food.</i>
Past Continuous	<i>We were eating tasty food.</i>	<i>She said that they had been eating tasty food.</i>
Present Perfect Simple	<i>We have eaten tasty food.</i>	<i>She said that they had eaten tasty food.</i>
Present Perfect Continuous	<i>We have been eating tasty food.</i>	<i>She said that they had been eating tasty food.</i>
Past Perfect Simple	<i>We had eaten tasty food.</i>	<i>She said that they had eaten tasty food.</i>
Past Perfect Continuous	<i>We had been eating tasty food.</i>	<i>She said that they had been eating tasty food.</i>
